We were able to enjoy a sumptuous buffet lunch provided by St. Barnabas and additional foot shaped cake and biscuit treats kindly made by Nicky. The families left with a lavender scent bag endorsed with our service 'tree of life' logo to help them remember their day and slices of delicious home-made foot shaped cake generously made by Heather.

Feedback from the day was positive and parents have since commented that they found the day "Inspiring" in terms of how some individuals have made changes to their lives and some of the older children remarked that they were glad of the chance to share their feelings with those of a similar age.

### A Spotlight On .... The Children's Community Nursing Team

The community children's nursing teams within the United Lincolnshire trust is a developing service consisting of three teams based in Lincoln, Grantham and Boston. Each team consists of experienced children's nurses and health care support workers. In addition, we also have access to specialist teams who we can involve if required to deliver appropriate care to our children and families. These include the family support team, a training team and specialist nurse in learning disabilities.

The teams have direct involvement with children and work closely with their parents and carers to provide advice, support and direct nursing care to infants, children and young people from birth to 18 years, who need ongoing nursing care and are under the care of a consultant paediatrician.

We do this by working in close partnership with other health care workers, including physiotherapists, occupational therapists, dieticians and other services involved with the child.


